Assisting Countries in Transition to join PIANC via Qualifying Membership (QM) progressing to National Section (NS) status

Collaborating and co-ordinating activities with other PIANC Commissions.

SC3 - PIANC- COPEDEC Conference:

The First International COPEDEC - Colombo Sri Lanka in March 1983.

The quadrennial PIANC-COPEDEC conference series remains a major conference for developing countries, its organisation and delivery a key responsibility of CoCom.

Ongoing goal of COPEDEC - equal registrations/attendees from developing and developed countries – in this it is unique.

COPEDEC is always held in a Country in Transition- The 10th COPEDEC conference originally scheduled for Nov 2020 has been postponed due to COVID and is now scheduled for the Philippines in late 2023.
